



**Montgomery County Election Board
Minutes
April 27, 2022**

Call to Order

Vice Chair Arkoosh called the meeting to order. All three Board members were present.

Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Vice Chair Arkoosh.

Election Board Comments

There was no Board comment.

Public Comment on Items Appearing on the Agenda – Limited to 2 Minutes

There was no public comment.

General Public Comment – Limited to 2 minutes

1. Ken Souder commented on ballot harvesting, investigating the findings and concerns from the 2020 election, over-stuffed voting machines, election rules, protocols and procedures.
2. Pauline Braccio spoke in opposition to public comment rules and how objections are handled during the meeting, following the Sunshine Law, explaining the objection notation, and plans to write a letter to the Court of Common Pleas about this matter.
3. Collette Pennland commented on the continued use of ballot drop boxes considering the pandemic has subsided, preventing mass ballot stuffing, possible election fraud, monitoring and securing the drop boxes, canvassing the election processes, cleaning up voter rolls, and keeping with election integrity.
4. Denise Penneconi mentioned that she did not receive a mail in ballot, but her spouse did at the same address, and expressed concerns with mail-in ballots possibly being sent to people without legal identification.
5. Kurt Stein commented on having total transparent elections, monitoring drop boxes for security, publicly displaying election-day processes in detail, and ensuring fair elections.

6. Jeanne White commented on Act 77 being unconstitutional, the constitution election processes, and concerns with voting machine malfunctions.
7. Robin Hallman spoke on ballot security concerns, passing legislature to eliminate ballot drop boxes in PA, possible election fraud, cleaning up voter rolls and reporting any suspicion of voter fraud at polling locations.
8. Daniel Burton spoke on upholding the constitution that elections are to be held on 1 day, believes in discontinuing the counting of ballots beyond the election-day, and eliminating drop boxes.
9. Marlene Laska commented in opposition of ballot drop boxes, mail-in ballots being unconstitutional, receiving more election process transparency, securing the drop boxes, and preserving the integrity of elections.

Approval of Minutes **April 21, 2022**

Vice Chair Arkoosh made a motion to approve the April 21, 2022 minutes of the Montgomery County Election Board.

Judge Wall seconded the motion.

There was no Board comment. There was no public comment. Vice Chair Arkoosh brought the motion to a vote and it was adopted.

Authorization of a Change to 1 Polling Location – Dori Sawyer, Director of Elections
