Call to Order

MONTGOMERY COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

August 18, 2022

On motion of Chair Arkoosh, seconded by Vice Chair Lawrence, it was adopted that:

BACKGROUND

1. On June 12, 2018, Governor Wolf signed Senate Bill 234 into law as Act 30 of 2018 (12 Pa. C. S. A. § 4301 et seq.). The statute authorizes counties and municipalities to establish a Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy program (“C-PACE program”).
2. On December 12, 2019, the Montgomery County Commissioners established the C-PACE Program for Montgomery County by Resolution 19-C.404.
3. On July 7, 2022, the Statute regarding C-PACE (12 Pa. C. S. A. § 4301 et seq.) was amended to expand the Program.
4. Pursuant to the amended Statute, a qualifying commercial property will include multifamily property of five or more units owned by an individual, partnership, corporation, limited liability corporation, or nonprofit. The term does not include any residential property, except for a commercial, multifamily rental property or mixed-use property which contains no less than five residential units.
5. The Amended Program includes financing for indoor air quality and resiliency improvements as defined in the Statute and as further defined in the Montgomery County C-PACE Program Guidelines.
6. The Amended Program ensures a county shall utilize the provisions under the act of July 7, 1947 (P.L. 1368, No.542), known as the Real Estate Tax Sale Law, or the act of May 16, 1923 (P.L.207 No. 153), referred to as the Municipal Claim and Tax Lien Law, to collect delinquent installments of assessments.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the proper County Officials, in accordance with the authority conferred by law, subject to the approval of the County Solicitor, are hereby authorized

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proper County Officials, in accordance with the authority conferred by law, subject to the approval of the County Solicitor, are hereby authorized to expand the Montgomery County

Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy Program in accordance with State Statute.

BACKGROUND

1. A comprehensive plan is a long-range plan required by state law for guiding the growth and physical development of a place.
2. The county plan provides an overall land use and growth management framework for local municipal plans and provides guidance on issues that transcend local boundaries, such as highways, public transportation, flooding, trails, growth trends, redevelopment trends, shopping needs, impact of large developments, overall housing needs, natural systems, economic growth, etc. The county plan is an advisory document used to guide county and local municipal policies.
3. The Montgomery County Planning Commission will be undertaking a project, starting in 2022, to update its comprehensive plan.
4. The Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development makes available grants-in-aid to such projects through the Municipal Assistance Program (MAP). The MAP provides funding to assist local governments to plan for and efficiently implement a variety of services and improvements.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the proper County Officials, in accordance with the authority conferred by law, subject to the approval of the County Solicitor, are hereby authorized to submit a grant application to the Municipal Assistance Program for an amount totaling SIXTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$60,000) and to commit to a match of in-kind services for an amount totaling NINETY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$90,000).

MONTGOMERY COUNTY COMMISSIONERS*August 18, 2022*

On motion of Chair Arkoosh, seconded by Vice Chair Lawrence, it was adopted that:

BACKGROUND

1. On March 11, 2021, Congress enacted the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), which established a new \$350 billion Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (SLFRF) for state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments to support immediate pandemic response, address economic fallout, and lay the foundation for a strong and equitable recovery.
2. The purpose of the ARPA SLFRF funding is to “provide needed relief to state, local, and Tribal governments to enable them to continue to support the public health response and lay the foundation for a strong and equitable economic recovery. In addition to helping these governments address the revenue losses they have experienced as a result of the crisis, it will help them cover the costs incurred due to responding to the public health emergency and provide support for a recovery – including through assistance to households, small businesses and nonprofits, aid to impacted industries, and support for essential workers. It will also provide resources for state, local, and Tribal governments to invest in infrastructure, including water, sewer, and broadband services.”
3. Montgomery County received \$161.4 Million in Pandemic Recovery funds and established a Recovery Office to manage the equitable distribution of these funds based on United States Treasury Department guidance
4. From March 1, 2022, through April 30, 2022, the Recovery Office accepted submissions to direct how the County would expend the Pandemic Recovery Funds.
5. Through its Recovery Office, the County received 426 project submissions and 159 idea submissions by the County’s April 30, 2022 deadline. The Recovery Office staff processed and analyzed all of the submissions which represented an unprecedented expression of the County community’s vision and needs.
6. Thereafter, the Recovery Office issued a Draft Recovery Plan that outlines the allocation of funds for 110 transformative projects with the potential for spurring long-term change across Montgomery County.

7. The public was able to provide feedback on the Plan through in-person and virtual town hall events or by submitting a written comment, from June 18 through August 5, 2022.
8. Following incorporation of the public feedback, the Recovery Office is presenting a final version of the Recovery Plan for formal adoption by the County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the proper County Officials, in accordance with the authority conferred by law, subject to the approval of the County Solicitor, hereby formally adopt the Montgomery County Pandemic Recovery Plan, authorizing the appropriate County officials to enter into agreements to realize the projects included therein and to submit the final plan as required to the US Treasury to document the County's use of the its Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund allocation.

BACKGROUND

1. Philadelphia Authority for Industrial Development (the “Authority”), proposes to issue tax-exempt and/or taxable Bonds (the “Bonds”) in an amount not to exceed THREE HUNDRED MILLION DOLLARS (\$300,000,000) to finance a project (the “Project”) for Saint Joseph’s University, a Pennsylvania nonprofit corporation and a tax-exempt organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “Code”).
2. The Project is proposed to include (i) the design, construction, renovation, and/or equipping of educational and related facilities, including, but not limited to, a residence hall, student center, academic buildings, a parking garage, and/or a science center, at the Borrower’s Hawk Hill campus, the administrative office of which is located at 5600 City Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and which 125-acre campus is located within the City of Philadelphia and the County of Montgomery, Pennsylvania; and (ii) the payment of the costs of issuing the Bonds.
3. The Authority has conducted a public hearing (the “TEFRA Hearing”) as required by and in accordance with Section 147(f) of the Code. 7. The TEFRA Hearing, after due and proper advertisement thereof being duly given according to law, was held on August 9, 2022.
4. The approval by this Board of County Commissioners, as evidenced by this Resolution, will enable the Authority to finance the Project, without imposing any liability on the County of Montgomery or its citizens or taxpayers with respect to the Bonds.
5. Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “Code”) requires that the applicable elected representative of the governmental unit on behalf of which bonds are issued and of each governmental unit having jurisdiction over the area in which any facility with respect to which financing is to be provided from the net proceeds of such bonds, is located, approve bonds after a public hearing in order for a private activity bond to be a qualified bond under the Code.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the proper County Officials, in accordance with the authority conferred by law, subject to the approval of the County Solicitor, hereby approve the Project for Saint Joseph's College as described in this Resolution and approve the issuance of Bonds by the Philadelphia Authority for Industrial Development for financing of the Project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the approvals and declarations in this Resolution shall in no way pledge or otherwise obligate the credit or taxing power of the County, nor shall the County be liable for the payment of principal or interest or premium, if any, on any obligations issued to finance the Project nor shall the County have any obligation or liability whatsoever with respect to the Project. This Resolution shall take effect on the date of adoption hereof.
