**Gallery Talk at Pennypacker Mills:
Who's Who Among Governors from Montgomery County**

Schwenksville, PA (July 10, 2013) – Come to Pennypacker Mills on Sunday, July 14, 2013 to learn about the seven men from Montgomery County who served as Governor of Pennsylvania. Delve into the galleries to find out who they were, the challenges they faced in office, and some of their great accomplishments. This event will last from 1:00pm to 2:00pm. Afterward, take a guided tour of the Pennypacker mansion and learn more about Samuel Pennypacker and his family, who lived in the mansion during the early 1900s. This event is free, but a donation of \$2.00 per person is suggested.

Guests are invited to stop by the 1900's History Center and explore exhibits and hands-on activities that will take them back in time. Visitors will get the chance to discover how people moved about using horses and buggies, visit the General Store, and see the newest exhibit on children working in the coal mines of Pennsylvania.

Pennypacker Mills Historic Site is operated by the Montgomery County Department of Assets and Infrastructure, Division of Parks, Trails, and Historic Sites.
