Wagging Tails on the Historic Trail at the Peter Wentz Farmstead
Saturday, November 8, 2014 from 10:00am-2:00pm

Worcester, PA (November 3, 2014) – Looking for a new place to walk the dog and enjoy nature? The historic Peter Wentz Farmstead has a trail suitable for people and pets. Join the staff at the Peter Wentz Farmstead on Saturday, November 8, 2014 from 10:00am-2:00pm to learn about the pet-friendly offerings at the site, visit with local canine rescue groups, and renew County dog licenses.

Pets and their owners will enjoy the 1.25 mile trail that encircles the historic site, which offers a step into a natural environment and a step back in time. The landscape looks much as it did in the 18th century with fallow fields, pasture land, orchard, gardens, stream bank, and woodlands that provide unique habitats for many wild species. So grab a trail brochure and enjoy the walk.

A variety of exhibitors will also be present to provide information, demonstrations, and services for dog owners. Take this opportunity to ask questions about specific breeds, adopting a pet, or renew a County dog license on the spot.
