Upper Dublin Township and Lower Providence Township Renew Contracts with Montco for Professional Planning Services

Norristown, PA (August 10, 2015) – Upper Dublin Township and Lower Providence Township have renewed their contracts for professional planning assistance from the Montgomery County Planning Commission (MCPC). The contracts are part of the Montgomery County Community Planning Assistance Program, which was established in 1950 to provide professional planning services that achieve a municipality’s vision for an exceptional community.

Upper Dublin’s contract involves a Fort Washington Office Park streetscape enhancement plan and enhanced design reviews. “We are glad to be partnering with Upper Dublin Township on their proactive approach to revitalizing the Fort Washington Office Park. This is an important office park in Montgomery County,” commented Jody L. Holton, AICP, MCPC Executive Director.

Lower Providence’s contract involves a Ridge Pike corridor land use and zoning study from Evansburg State Park to West Norriton and enhanced design reviews. “We are excited to extend the zoning work we’ve completed for Lower Providence Township along West Ridge Pike eastward to the border with West Norriton. Coupled with the Ridge Pike corridor work we expect to begin for West Norriton Township, the new land use and zoning study will provide a blueprint for improving a significant commercial corridor in the county,” said Holton.

Over half of the municipalities in Montgomery County, including four regional planning areas, are participating in the county’s Community Planning Assistance Program. Program work accomplished typically focuses on smart growth, economic development, the environment, sustainability, and parks and recreation. While specific planners work with individual municipalities, MCPC’s planning services involve a comprehensive approach that utilizes the extensive expertise of its team of professionals.
