## **FOUR POTTSTOWN MEN CHARGED WITH THE MARCH 30<sup>TH</sup> MURDER OF KEITH ROBINSON IN POTTSTOWN**

*Two men arrested and two—Elijah Davis and Derrick Goins—still Being Sought*

NORRISTOWN, Pa. (Aug. 1, 2019) — Montgomery County District Attorney Kevin R. Steele and Pottstown Borough Police Chief Michael J. Markovich announce the charging of Kyshan Brinkley, 23; Jacquan Lee, 26; Elijah Davis, 18; and Derrick Goins, 26, all of Pottstown, for the March 30, 2019 murder of Keith Robinson, age 41, in Pottstown. Brinkley and Lee are in custody, and arrest warrants have been issued for Davis and Goins. The First-Degree Murder and related charges against the four men came after the Montgomery County Investigating Grand Jury found probable cause and recommended the charges in its Presentment.

The investigation began when Pottstown Police found Robinson in his car, dead of multiple gunshot wounds at 10:53 p.m., on Saturday, March 30, 2019. The Montgomery County Detective Bureau and Pottstown Police launched a joint homicide investigation. At the scene, detectives determined that Robinson was shot through the window of his vehicle. Near the passenger side window of the vehicle, nine .40 caliber fired cartridge casings were found. An additional fired cartridge casing was found next to a trash can, which also contained a distinctive black jacket. On March 31, 2019, during an autopsy Dr. Gregory McDonald of the Montgomery County Coroner's Office recovered two bullets from Robinson's body.

The criminal complaint, which incorporated the Grand Jury's Presentment, revealed that the Montgomery County Detective Bureau's Violent Crime Unit and the Pottstown Police had been investigating a home-grown gang operating in the Pottstown area called "Bud Gang Bitch," or "BGB," at the time of the murder. The gang is a reference to Jordan "Bud" Scott, a Pottstown resident who was shot and killed in Norristown in July 2017. This investigation led to the identification of many of the members of "BGB," including the four defendants, as well as 'BGB's' base of operations as 206 Manatawny Street. Additionally, investigation into this criminal organization revealed that its members are involved in illegal drug trafficking, illegally possessing firearms and are connected to at least two shootings. The criminal complaint also outlined the connection between Brinkley, Lee, Davis and Goins to the firearms, shooting location and victim. Video surveillance placed Goins and the other three defendants at the scene.

Following their investigation, the Presentment by the Montgomery County Grand Jury recommended charges of First-Degree Murder, Conspiracy to Commit Murder, Possessing an Instrument of Crime and other related charges against all four defendants. The District Attorney's Office then filed the charges, and Brinkley and Lee were arrested and arraigned on July 26, 2019, before Magisterial District Judge Edward C. Kropp Sr. No bail is available for First-Degree Murder, and both defendants were remanded to the Montgomery County Correctional Facility. A preliminary hearing is scheduled for 9 a.m., Aug. 26, 2019, before Magisterial District Judge Scott T. Palladino.

Arrest warrants for Davis and Goins have been issued. The men are considered dangerous. If they are spotted, members of the public should call 911. Anyone with information on Goins and Davis' whereabouts is asked to call the Pottstown Police Department at 610-970-6570 or Montgomery County Detectives at 610-226-5553. Anonymous text tips can be submitted using MontcoCrimeTips on the STOPit! app. The STOPit! app can be downloaded for free from the App Store for iPhones or Google Play for Androids, then use code MONTCOPA to get the Montgomery County version of the app.

The case will be prosecuted by Assistant District Attorneys Kelly Lloyd and Lindsey Mills.
