**Gov. Wolf appoints Montco Sheriff Kilkenny to County Records Committee**

**Norristown, Pa. (January 30, 2017)** – Montgomery County Sheriff Sean P. Kilkenny has been appointed by Governor Tom Wolf to serve on the County Records Committee.

The Committee, comprised of elected officials, members of the judiciary, and attorneys from across the commonwealth, develops policies relating to record retention and works with the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission to identify and preserve records that have value for historical research purposes. Kilkenny will serve a four-year term.

“It is with humble honor that I accept Governor Wolf’s appointment,” said Kilkenny. “I look forward to collaborating with other professionals to serve Montgomery County in this new role.”

Since becoming sheriff, Kilkenny has minimized costs, created efficiencies, and increased transparency, in order to deliver better and faster services to clients, and reduce the office’s eco-footprint.

Kilkenny is a U.S. Army Reserve Lieutenant Colonel and paratrooper currently assigned to the 153<sup>rd</sup> LOD in Horsham. He served overseas in Iraq, Kosovo, Bosnia and South Korea, and later as a federal prosecutor in the U.S. Army where he tried homicide, rape and other serious crimes for over 20 years.

As the principal of The Law Offices of Sean Kilkenny, he specializes in municipal law and public land regulation in Montgomery County, and serves as the solicitor in several townships. Kilkenny formerly served as Jenkintown Borough Council President, and is currently a trustee of Montgomery County Community College.

Kilkenny received his undergraduate degree from Villanova University. He holds a master of public administration from the University of South Carolina, a law degree from Temple University and a master of strategic studies from the U.S. Army War College.
