

### **Process for Registration:**

To register for services, please contact our Intake Coordinator at 610-278-5666.

We will request the following documentation in order to determine the individual's eligibility for services:

- A psychological evaluation from a licensed psychologist, certified school psychologist, physician, or psychiatrist with full-scale I.Q. results (70 or below) and a diagnosis of intellectual disability.
- Evidence of the onset of intellectual disability prior to the individual's 22nd birthday.
- Evidence individual has significant limitation in adaptive functioning in at least two of the following areas:

Communication, self-care, home living, social/interpersonal skills, use of community resources, self direction, functional academic skills, work, health, and safety.

## Who We Are:

Created under the Pennsylvania Mental Health and Intellectual Disability Act of 1966, Montgomery County Office of Developmental Disabilities is responsible for administrative oversight and development of services for people with a diagnosis of intellectual disability.

## Our Mission:

The Montgomery County Office of Developmental Disabilities is a Human Services Organization that serves children, adults, and families, ensures quality services and promotes choice, partnership and community understanding.

## Our Vision:

The Montgomery County Office of Developmental Disabilities will ensure quality and sufficient supports to individuals we serve, to enable them to be successful in the life they choose, and to assist them to fully participate in the community with dignity and respect.

## Intellectual Disability Services Provided:

### Supports Coordination

Supports Coordination is the link between a person with disabilities and the system of services that can be used to support them. The Supports Coordinator's primary duties revolve around three critical themes: Locating, Coordinating, and Monitoring of services and supports.

### Supported Employment

This service consists of job finding and job support. It includes interview assistance, employer outreach, placement and orientation, job training, and on-going support with the individual and their employer.

### Transitional Work Services

This service supports individuals in transition to integrated community employment. Transitional work service options include, but are not limited to, mobile work force, work station in industry, affirmative industry, apprenticeship and enclaves.

### Vocational Services/Day Programs

This service is provided to individuals to prepare them for paid employment. Individuals are taught concepts such as task completion, safety, problem solving, following direction and dependability.

### Community Habilitation (Adult Training Facilities)

This service, provided by Adult Training Facilities (ATF), assists individuals in acquiring, maintaining and improving self-help, domestic, socialization and adaptive skills.

### Home & Community Habilitation

This service provides assistance to individuals to acquire, maintain and improve self-help, domestic, socialization and adaptive skills. Through this service individuals learn, maintain or improve skills through their participation in a variety of everyday life activities of interest to them.

### Respite Services

Respite services provide temporary relief for the caregiver responsible for the care and supervision of an individual receiving services.

### Transportation Service

This service provides transportation for individuals to enable them to access services, activities or supports in accordance with their individual support plans (ISPs).

### Residential Habilitation

Housing is a residential service that includes Community Homes, Lifesharing, and Supported Living for individuals with a diagnosis of intellectual disability.

*Access to these services, with the exception of Supports Coordination, depends on the availability of funds.*
