Norristown, Pa. (December 18, 2017) – The Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office and U.S. Army Recruiting Division leadership held a signing ceremony to solidify the Partnership for Youth Success

The Partnership for Youth Success (PaYS) Program is a strategic partnership between the Army and a cross-section of corporations, companies, and public sector agencies. The Program provides America’s youth with an opportunity to serve their country while they prepare for their future.

“Having a diverse and highly trained workforce helps make us smarter and stronger,” said Montgomery County Sheriff Sean P. Kilkenny. “We need a variety of perspectives to help us create solutions that can best help our communities.”

The Army PaYS Program provides employers with a pool of highly skilled, motivated and professional candidates from which they may fill their staffing needs. Enlistees can search the PaYS website for potential employers, who will guarantee them an interview and possible employment after the Army.

Since the MCSO added an open deputy sheriff position on the PaYS website, ten service members have already chosen the MCSO as a place they would like to work.

“We would love to have these talented folks back in our communities,” said Kilkenny. “Based on their training and experience, they have the right values and skills to succeed in our office.”
