April 15 - 26, 2019 **BASIC POLICE MOTORCYCLE OPERATORS CERTIFICATION #1**

This Montgomery County Chiefs of Police EVOC Program Course is a ten (10) day, 80 hour, course designed for Police Officers who are assigned to Police Motorcycle Patrol duties. This course will introduce these officers to the uniqueness of Motorcycle Patrol. The course will cover machine nomenclature, slow maneuvering, control, curve negotiation, motorcycle maintenance, night operations, defensive driving techniques and on the street riding. The course will involve classroom instruction and street driving. Students must successfully complete written and practical exams to receive certification for the course.

Note: Students attending must be properly licensed to operate a motorcycle and must bring a police department owned motorcycle. Additionally, students must bring a DOT approved helmet, leather gloves (not fingerless gloves), ankle or higher boots, eye protection, wrap around preferred, and rain gear. Pre-registration required.

April 24-26, 2019 **POLICE MOTORCYCLE OPERATORS RE-CERTIFICATION #1**

This Montgomery County Chiefs of Police EVOC Program Course is a three (3) day course designed for officers who have already completed the Basic Police Motorcycle Operator Certification course. This course will provide these officers with an opportunity to update the skills they learned in the basic course. Students **must attend all three days** to receive their recertification. Students must also successfully complete written and practical exams to receive certification for the course. Note: Students attending must bring a police department motorcycle. Pre-registration required.

This Montgomery County Chiefs of Police EVOC Program Course is a one (1) day course designed for officers who routinely are assigned to drive a SUV or prisoner transport vehicle. This course will provide these officers with an opportunity to apply the skills they learned in the Basic EVOC course while driving a larger vehicle. Defensive Driving techniques and Emergency Response tactics will be demonstrated to and practiced by those attending. The course will be 1/2 day of behind the wheel driving skills that will include response course as well as a skill course that will include backing. Students must successfully

complete written and practical exams to receive certification for the course. Students attending should report to the PSTC, in old clothes.

NOTE: students attending the SUV course must bring a police department owned SUV or prisoner van to drive on the driving range.

This course will be 1/2 day in the classroom and 1/2 day on the driving course. **Officers attending should bring their duty belt, holster and bullet proof vest with them to this course.**

In teaching these techniques, the course also promotes an attitude of mutual understanding, courtesy and cooperation on the road. Topics covered include: general backing techniques, foul weather driving, crash avoidance, parking lot driving and braking techniques.

NOTE: Attendees should bring a sedan vehicle to class in order to participate in the practical evolutions. Student must be at least 18 years of age and possess a valid Pennsylvania Operator's License.

In teaching these techniques, the course also promotes an attitude of mutual understanding, courtesy and cooperation on the road. Topics covered include: general backing techniques, foul weather driving, crash avoidance, parking lot driving and braking techniques.

NOTE: Attendees should bring a work truck to class in order to participate in the practical evolutions. Students must be at least 18 years of age and possess a valid Pennsylvania Operator's License (CDL if applicable).

May 29, 2019 **EVOC SKILLS for SVU'S #2**

This Montgomery County Chiefs of Police EVOC Program Course is a one (1) day course designed for officers who have already completed a Basic EVOC course, including police academy training. **(This class is open to Montgomery County Police Officers ONLY.)** Students will exhibit an understanding of proactive driving, (using superior knowledge to avoid situations requiring superior skills). Participants will develop a better understanding of their individual abilities to effectively operate an SVU on patrol and during emergency driving situations. Students will have a rudimentary understanding of vehicle dynamics as they apply to vehicle and driver. Students must successfully complete written and practical exams to receive certification for the course.

Students attending should report to the PSTC in old clothes.

POLICE MOTORCYCLE ESCORT #1

This Montgomery County Chiefs of Police EVOC Program Course is a one (1) day course. Operators will receive classroom instruction and hands on practical exercises in the various areas of police motorcade escort. The training will include both dignitary and funeral escort procedures. Students must successfully complete written and practical exams to receive certification for the course.

Prerequisite: Successful completion of the Basic Police Motorcycle Operator Course. Students must bring a Police Department owned motorcycle. Pre-registration required.

PROCEDURES FOR ADMISSION

Municipal Police and Other Law Enforcement Officers

NOTE: Training is available only to sworn law enforcement officers and approved employees of law enforcement agencies.

The Application for Enrollment in State Police Training Course, Form SP 8-130, is the only form which shall be used by municipal police officers registering for any course listed in the Training Calendar. A copy of the form is provided in the back of this calendar and may be reproduced as needed. Copies of the form are also available at the Academy and the Regional Training Centers. Student confirmations are made via written correspondence. **Without prior confirmation, students will not be admitted to the class.**

Applications shall be submitted directly to the Academy unless otherwise noted in the course description. When submitting an application via fax, it is not necessary to submit the original application.

Applications must be received no less than 30 days in advance of the scheduled course. A check, payable to the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania," shall be forwarded upon receipt of confirmation notice where special fees, lodging, or meals are applicable. Reimbursements will be made in accordance with established procedures; however, no refunds will be made for meals which are paid for in advance when the student chooses not to eat at the Academy. A separate check is not required for each student; however, when paying with a single check, applications must be for the same training course and the applicant(s) name(s) and course title must be reflected on the check. The Bureau of Training and Education will determine class composition, and all students will be notified as soon as possible. Non-Department applicants will be instructed in the confirmation notice to contact the Bishop Connare Center regarding meal and lodging issues when training is being conducted at the Southwest Training Center.

If reasonable accommodations are required for a person with a disability, please contact the training facility to be attended at least 14 days before the course begins.

In the event that a scheduled student is unable to attend a course, your department may substitute another student not less than five days prior to the start of the course. When time permits, this will require the submission of a new application; otherwise, telephone notification will be accepted, and the student will be required to hand carry the approved application to the training facility. Telephone notifications of cancellations, made to the Academy, will be accepted and must be received at least five days prior to the start of a course.

NOTE:

The class will be held at the Montgomery County Public Safety Training Campus, 1175 Conshohocken Road, Conshohocken, PA. The employing agency of each participating student will be invoiced a Range Maintenance fee of \$100.00 payable to the County of Montgomery. Payment information will be included on the invoice. COURSE DESCRIPTIONS:

August 13, 2019

CONCEALED CARRY FOR THE PLAIN CLOTHES OFFICER: This course is designed for Police Officers who carry a firearm on and off duty in plainclothes. Topics of instruction will include: the types and styles of concealed holsters, firearms carrying positions and their pros and cons, on-duty/off-duty survival mind-set, hands-on drills, and live fire range drills.

January 21-25, 2019

MUNICIPAL POLICE FIREARMS INSTRUCTOR (MPFI): The course is designed to educate the experienced Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Officer on various methods used to conduct Firearms Qualification and training for their Municipal Police Department. Weapon systems that are covered are Semi-Automatic handgun, Revolver, Pump Action Shotgun and Semi-Automatic Shotgun. Carbine Instruction is covered under a separate 3-day training class. Students will be required to demonstrate proficiency with their handgun at the beginning and end of the course. The student must be able to score 85% or better upon completion of the course with their handgun and shotgun and score 75% or better on a written test.

PREREQUISITE(S): The student must be able to score 85% or better on the first day of instruction with their handgun. Failure to demonstrate proficiency at this level will result in the student being unenrolled.

MUNICIPAL POLICE RIFLE INSTRUCTOR (MPRI): This three-day course is designed for the experienced police officer possessing above-average proficiency in the use of firearms. Students will be required to score 90% (90/100 phase one and 135/150 phase two) or higher on the rifle course and 90% or higher on a written exam to receive the Patrol Rifle Firearms Instructor's Certificate. **THIS COURSE WILL BE**

LIMITED TO THE AR PLATFORM RIFLE WITH A MINIMUM OF A 16” BARREL TO A 20” BARREL. No short-barreled rifles (SBR’s) or AR-pistols will be authorized for use in this course. Instruction will include: List and locate the nomenclature of the AR platform rifle, patrol rifle marksmanship skills, patrol rifle handling, body positions and rifle positions, zeroing the patrol rifle with iron sights, sighting in optics, daytime and nighttime shooting drills, rifle combat qualification course, patrol rifle instructor assessment and field strip, clean and maintain the AR platform rifle. **PREREQUISITE(S):** Must have a Valid Firearms Instructor certificate – Certificate should accompany the enrollment application.

February 20, 2019 1600-2400hrs

PATROL RESPONSE TO SUICIDE BOMBER: This class will aid the student in identifying possible suicide/homicide bomber characteristics, devices, and methods. This course is designed to enhance the officer's ability to respond to encounters with suspected or actual suicide bombers utilizing personally worn or carried explosive devices. The student will also be able to determine the "best practices" response to a suicide bomber. The student will participate in classroom lecture as well as hands-on drills and live fire exercises.

July 15-17, 2019 & August 5-7, 2019

TACTICAL CARBINE FOR RESPONDING OFFICERS: This course is designed for police officers that may need the patrol carbine during an un-planned event (active shooter, domestic terrorism, domestic situations and other dynamic calls where a first responder might employ a rifle). This course will enhance the student’s ability to deploy and “work” the patrol rifle in a variety of situations. Skills will be enhanced in shooting and moving, deploying from the patrol vehicle, shooting at night, jam clearing and reloading and transition to other force options. While there is no prerequisite, the student should have a solid understanding of the M16/M4 carbine platform. This course is limited to 16 students per class.
