The British Are Coming!

Hear ye, hear ye! By order of His Majesty King George III you are hereby invited to visit the Peter Wentz Farmstead! During the winter of 1777 and into the spring of 1778, the Continental army was encamped at Valley Forge while British troops occupied Philadelphia. Both sides sent out patrols to gather intelligence and supplies. Sometimes British patrols extended fairly far into what is now Bucks and Montgomery County. Visit the Farmstead on May 6th and 7th to meet members of the Queens Rangers and British Light Infantry men to learn about those trying times for citizens and soldiers alike. All ages; free

Join the Peter Wentz Farmstead in observation of Juneteenth, the holiday commemorating the emancipation of Black enslaved people in America. We will spotlight the story of Jack, a man who was enslaved by Peter Wentz and who made two attempts to escape to freedom. Through telling Jack's story, we hope to educate the public about the little-known history of slavery in Pennsylvania. The Peter Wentz Farmstead is a designated National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom site.

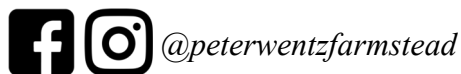

Colonial Camp

Have you ever dreamed of traveling into the past? Well, we may not have a time machine, but we've got the next best thing. Join us this summer for the Peter Wentz Farmstead's Colonial Camp, where you can step back into the eighteenth century and live like a colonial farmer for a week!

This year's Colonial Camp will run from July 10th to July 14th from 9:30 am to 2:30 pm. Each day, our living historians will lead campers through hands-on demonstrations of historical crafts, like quill-and-ink calligraphy, ceramics, woodworking, and more. You don't have to be a history buff to have a good time! We'll be covering a wide range of topics like art, nature, agriculture, and technology. Colonial Camp is for kids going into 4th–6th grade. The cost for the week is \$150 per child.
