

Pennsylvania State Highway Patrolman Andrew W. Miller E.O.W. 4/1/1928

Patrolman Andrew W. Miller made his ultimate sacrifice on April 1st, 1928. At 9:30 p.m. on April 1st, while Miller was patrolling through the city of Pottstown, his motorcycle skid on the street car tracks. He was thrown from the motorcycle, fell to the brick street, and was seriously injured. He was taken to A. C. Shute Homeopathic Hospital in Pottstown where he lost his life at 11:55 p.m. that day. Patrolman Miller enlisted with the State Highway Patrol August 8th, 1927, from Galeton, Pennsylvania, and was assigned to Troop A, Harrisburg, serving with them for seven months before losing his life. Patrolman Miller was twenty years old at the time of his sacrifice. He was survived by his parents, Herman and Susan Miller.
